Historical Note: Erected in 1880, the Exposition Building had been preceded by Bechtner's Skating Rink and, later, the West Side Market: 1867-1880. [As early as 1855, however, Milwaukee's first roller skating rink had been built at this same location]. The Exposition Building was touted as "the finest in the country," the Music Hall having had a seating capacity of 6,000. The site of concerts, carnivals, expositions, festivals, and other gatherings of all kinds, the building was sadly destroyed by fire on the afternoon of Sunday, June 4, 1905.
